	Halls used for indoor football will be free of hazardous projections, unprotected windows/lights, low level mirrors, and equipment projecting from walls which are adjacent to the playing area. The Hall floor will be in good condition and be free from slipping /tripping hazards.	✓				
	In adverse/inclement weather school will make a decision on which areas are safe to use.	✓
